### **Eddie Airheart - Youth Choir**

is in his 11th year as Pastor of Worship & Arts at Cornerstone Bible Fellowship in Sherwood/North Little Rock, Arkansas. A native Texan, he attended Texas A&M – Commerce where, while pursuing an all-level Music Education degree, he studied instrumental wind conducting with Professor Gary W. Hill, clarinet with Dr. James Deaton, piano with Dr. John Harris and voice/vocal conducting with Dr. Bill Gorham. As Pastor of Worship & Arts at Cornerstone, Mr. Airheart is responsible for overall worship leadership as well as identifying, leading and developing artists...musicians, actors, visual artists, technical artists, and dancers. The “Celebration Singers of Central Arkansas,” a YouthCUE member choir which he founded in 2000, has toured from coast to coast since its inception as well as attended nine consecutive YouthCUE Festivals.



### **Judy Britts - Lower Elementary**

has over 30 years experience training young singers, ranging from the youngest beginning singer to the middle school boy with a changing voice to the high school singer preparing for a career in music. As the Director of Training Choirs for Sacramento Children’s Chorus, she prepared hundreds of Children for their award winning touring group. Through her career, Mrs. Britts has conducted choirs in large churches with 60 members in each choir to small churches with just six members. Mrs. Britts is a regular contributor to the Choristers Guild Journal, the Chorister with her series, “Elements of Choral Rehearsal.” She has conducted festivals and camps and led workshops for the San Francisco, Pittsburg, Washington, Atlanta, Sacramento, San Diego, Orange County and Kansas City Choristers Guild Chapters.



### **Dana Effler - Adult Choir**

is Director of Music and Arts Ministries at First United Methodist Church of Dallas, where she administers a program of eight singing choirs, six handbell choirs, Orff ensemble, a theatre series, and an art gallery. She received her undergraduate degree in Music Education from Furman University, and Masters Degrees in Choral Conducting and Vocal Performance from Southern Methodist University. Other professional pursuits include her work as a singer, guest conductor, workshop clinician and teacher for such organizations as the American Choral Directors Association, Texas Choral Directors Association, Choristers Guild, and The Fellowship of United Methodists in Music and Worship Arts. Her hobbies include cooking, running, reading, performing in musicals and taking care of her cocker-spaniels, Molly and Monya.



### **Michael J. Glasgow - Handbells**

is originally from Michigan. He holds B.A. degrees in music theory/composition, and in journalism; as well as a Master of Church Music degree, in both choral and handbell music. In addition to many professional affiliations and his full-time position at North Raleigh UMC (Raleigh, NC), Michael serves as Bass Section Leader for the North Carolina Master Chorale and the Choral Conductor for the Tar River Orchestra & Chorus. An award-winning composer, he keeps busy with commissions and his own projects, which strive to creatively advance the art of handbell ringing. He also serves as the editor for the AGEHR Area III newsletter, *The Bell-O-Gram*, and is a member of ASCAP and American Composers Forum.

# Workshop Clinicians



## **Marty Haugen - Worship**

is a liturgical composer, workshop presenter, performing and recording artist & author from Eagan, Minnesota. He and his wife, Linda, have two children with good partners and a recent grandson. Marty currently serves as composer-in-residence at Mayflower United Church of Christ in Minneapolis and serves occasionally as adjunct instructor at United Theological Seminary in New Brighton, Minnesota. He has over 35 recordings and more than 400 separate printed editions available through GIA Publications. A number of his published songs, including "Shepherd Me, O God," "Gather Us In" and "All Are Welcome" are well-known to many religious denominations.



## **Benjamin Kolodziej - Organ**

is Chapel Organist at Southern Methodist University, Dallas, TX, where he has been an adjunct lecturer in sacred music at Perkins School of Theology and where he plays organ for 150 weddings, memorials, and civic events a year at historic Perkins Chapel. Since 1999 he has also been Organist and Director of Worship at Lord of Life Lutheran Church, Plano, TX, where he oversees an active music ministry including several choirs and two concert series. Mr. Kolodziej holds Master of Sacred Music, and a Master of Theological Studies degrees from Perkins School of Theology, SMU, where he studied organ with Robert Anderson, George Baker, and Larry Palmer. He won first place in the Dallas AGO Young Organist Competition and was awarded the hymn playing prize at the William B. Hall Organ Competition. He is presently writing for the new Lutheran Service Book Hymnal Companion, to be published in 2011 by Concordia Publishing House.



## **Susan LaPointe - Pre-School**

has over 20 years experience working with children and youth in both church and classroom settings. Susan is Director of Children's Music Ministry and Instrumental Music Ministry at First Presbyterian Church in Ft. Worth Texas. Susan directs the children's vocal, handbell, and orff choirs, as well as multiple adult and youth instrumental ensembles that range from the classical to the contemporary. She is also the First Presbyterian Day School Music Director where she teaches over one hundred of our youngest aspiring musicians. Susan creates and directs two music and art camps each summer for over 150 elementary and preschool children throughout the area. She is an active teacher and clinician at conferences from Texas to North Carolina. Susan holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in Piano Performance from the University of Houston Moores School of Music and is currently completing her Master of Theological Studies at Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University. Susan currently serves as President of the Dallas Chapter of Choristers Guild.



## **Heather Potter - Upper Elementary**

is an Associate Conductor with the Charlotte Children's Choir where she conducts Lyric Choir, the upper intermediate choir in the children's division. She also serves as the Director of Youth and Children's Music at First Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in Gastonia, North Carolina. As an active clinician, Dr. Potter frequently conducts treble ensembles for music conferences and festivals and presents children's choir training workshops. She serves on the Choristers Guild National Board and the advisory board for the Choristers Guild Institute. Dr. Potter holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in music education from Furman University, a Master of Music degree in choral music education from Arizona State University, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.
